Annual Report of the Pastor

Introduction

In the Church of the Nazarene, the pastor is required to submit an annual report to the congregation each year. Though it isn't required to be delivered on a Sunday morning, I believe it to be helpful to give my annual report in the context of a worship service as it serves to remind us that everything we do as a church is an offering of worship to our Lord. Every good thing is to the glory of God, and everything short of what it should be is offered to God as well, to be redeemed, sanctified, and used for his purposes.

So today, I count it my privilege to bring to you my fifth annual report as pastor of Morgan Church of the Nazarene. Over my years here, I have spent much time on the trails at Riverside Park, and the river itself has become a sort of prayer partner for me. The song I sang this morning returns to me again and again, "Let the River Flow." The river reminds me of the movement of the Spirit. Several times God has spoken to me while I peered out at the water. I want to share three helpful images the Lord has given me.

Helpful Images from the River

The first came to me on a windy day. The wind blew across the surface of the water, and if I didn't know better, I would have been convinced that the river was flowing in the opposite direction. The river appeared to be moving what I knew to be backward. And yet, I knew which direction the river flowed. And I also knew, below the surface, the river was still going the right way. In the church, sometimes we get caught up with what is on the surface. And sometimes on the surface it feels like we are moving backwards. And yet, when we are faithfully seeking the Lord, the Holy Spirit continues to work in the church and do the deep work. God is at work below the surface. Let the River Flow.

The second image came to me at a different time, while on the rainbow bridge. No matter how many times I go out to look at the river, it always looks different. The sandbars are always in different places. The depth, the strength of the current, the clarity of the water; it is always changing. And yet, it is the same river, and it keeps flowing. Things in the church are always changing; people change; seasons change, schedules change, the culture changes, the politics change, our lives change, circumstances change. Everything changes, but it is still Christ's church, and the Spirit keeps flowing. God is always at work. Let the river flow, Holy Spirit come, and move in power.

The third image is the meandering of the river. The river rarely takes the most direct route. Sometimes large sandbars look to inhibit the free flow of the river, but the water always finds its way around. Sometimes moving laterally before it can move forward. And the river itself meanders, this way and that way. Again, in the church, we meander. For better or worse, we don't often take the most direct route (sometimes this is by God's design, we have a lot of learning to do on the way). At times, it takes significant effort just to get into a position to move forward. Sometimes there are barriers that block the path and we must shift directions. And yet, with the Lord's leadership, we keep moving, the river keeps flowing. Let the River Flow – Holy Spirit come and move in power.

In all three images, the river still flows. In all our struggles, changes, and meandering, may we always be attentive to the Holy Spirit, acknowledging the Spirit is still at work in us. Let the River Flow, Holy Spirit come, and move in power.

The Work of the Holy Spirit in the Church

In the scriptures, the imagery of water is used in several places. To name just a few; Jesus speaks of living water which forever quenches the thirst of the one who drinks it. Baptism waters are for repentance, forgiveness, and full acceptance into the people of God. The Holy Spirit is "poured out," contributing to the image of water pouring over those who seek the Lord.

That imagery is found in our text, Acts 10:44-47

⁴⁴ While Peter was still saying these things, the Holy Spirit fell on all who heard the word. ⁴⁵ And the believers from among the circumcised who had come with Peter were amazed, because the gift of the Holy Spirit was poured out even on the Gentiles. ⁴⁶ For they were hearing them speaking in tongues and extolling God. Then Peter declared, ⁴⁷ "Can anyone withhold water for baptizing these people, who have received the Holy Spirit just as we have?"

These images of water flowing have made an impression on me in ways I cannot escape.

What God Has Done

The book of Acts tells of the acts of the Holy Spirit in the early church. Before our text from chapter 10, God had already done many great things! The Spirit had been poured out on God's people in Jerusalem. Lives had been transformed by the Spirit, and the Christian community was being formed! The Spirit had also been poured out on believers in Samaria, and even an Ethiopian from the ends of the earth was baptized. God was on the move! Peter could testify to the many acts of God up to this point in the story.

Likewise, God has been at work here, and I can testify to it! First, it is appropriate to acknowledge the faithfulness of all who came before me, before us, who laid a foundation on which to build. God has been faithfully at work here for nearly 100 years, and though the legacy is imperfect, we receive a legacy of faithfulness.

I am also incredibly thankful for last year's board members who faithfully carried out their duties and served the church with humility. Our Stewards – Richard Lapp, Caleb Christensen, and Russel Daniel. Our Trustees – Jim Goss, Curt Christensen, and Shawn Schrum. As well as our NYI President – Cynthia Lapp and NMI President – Susan Goss. Bobby Sue Schrum was our recording secretary.

I also thank God for the gift of great staff I have the privilege of working with. Stacey Fajardo has served as the Children's Ministry Director for several years. Now, in the new fiscal year, she has a new title, Disciples Ministries Director, and a broader range of responsibilities. Jake Fajardo and Brianna Everhart have shared the responsibility of leading our music ministries. Brianna also makes sure our nursery is staffed. Kali Christensen serves as the administrative assistant/church secretary. And Stashia Keller cleans the building each week. It is truly a joy to serve with such great people and be companions on the journey of discipleship.

And God has empowered this church for great ministry! And we do more ministry than most churches our size! We have had great ministry for children and youth. We were able to provide meals on Wednesdays from September through April. We had outreach events, our Compass Weekend, district events and camps. Many participated in the seasons of Advent and Lent together. Many participated in the ministry at Landmark last summer. A few from our church participated in the district Work &Witness project at Mission 5280. Our Compassionate

Services provided clothes and other items to about 200 people. We are involved in our community. We have done much, accomplished much, and have kept ourselves busy. But God's work isn't about measuring ministry, counting ministries, or keeping ourselves busy, but about what God does through the work of ministry in the lives of those who serve as well as those who are served. We are being formed to be a people who reflect God's character.

And ministry doesn't happen apart from the people who participate. I am grateful for all who have served in various capacities; Sunday school teachers, ushers, greeters, youth and children's volunteers, meal-preparers for Wednesday as well as those who prepared meals for those who were sick or recovering from surgery. I am thankful for all who faithfully tithe as well as others who give of their finances. Though our giving was down this past year, God has provided for the ministries of the church through His people. Our average total Sunday morning attendance was 84, in-person attendance was 76, and our list of regular volunteers is over 50. If we extend that to include all who occasionally serve, we are close to 70 people engaged in doing ministry. I have never been part of a church that has such a high percentage of its people actively engaged in ministry.

We can testify to the work of God here in this place and among His people. Work that goes far beyond lists of people and projects. God has done work in this past year to form us to be a better reflection of his character. He has formed us to be better disciples. And he is teaching us how to better make disciples. God is faithful and has faithfully worked among us in ways that cannot be measured or quantified. Let the River flow.

What God is Doing

In our scripture, though God had done much already, God wasn't done yet. God was still at work, and the Holy Spirit was poured out on those Gentile believers. God was still moving in big ways, and Peter and those with him had the privilege of witnessing it! Likewise, God is still at work here, and what a privilege it is to be part of it!

Several new families are participating in the ministry. We baptized 2 on Easter. Marriages are being mended. Hearts are being softened. People are hearing the Lord's voice and feeling called to serve in new ways. God is calling some to become who they are meant to be. Some to do what they are meant to do. Others to give what they ought to give. The Holy Spirit is still working in peoples' lives today and I cherish my front-row seat!

People are eager to learn and grow and are asking questions about how to better understand the Bible. People seek Christian fellowship and encouragement. I testify to you today that the Holy Spirit is working here and now! God is presently at work transforming hearts and lives, pouring out his Spirit on those who seek Him. He is bringing redemption, wholeness, and life.

The Spirit is with us as we plan our ministries in this season, calling us once again to the community at Landmark. God is orchestrating great things beyond what we expected. God is bringing us into contact with others who seek His leadership in their lives.

The Spirit is at work in us as a church, forming us to be an authentic expression of His Kingdom. We don't just report on what God has done in the past; we declare that God is at work today! Let the River flow. Holy Spirit come and move in power!

What God May Do in the Future

And in Acts 10, Peter recognized that God was at work and said, "who can withhold the water..." Who can stop what God is doing? Let the River flow. Who can stand in the way once the floodgates of Heaven are opened? And as those Gentiles were baptized and entered fully into the people of God, it changed the trajectory of the church forever. God poured out his Spirit, and the waters could not be contained. God was working beyond the imagination of the early church.

Likewise, our imagination for the church cannot be a return to the glory days of long ago when things were bigger and better, it cannot be winning the culture wars or regaining cultural relevance. We must have an ever-expanding imagination of what God might have us do and who he would have us be! We must have open minds as we allow the Spirit to lead us.

And it is my prayer that we would let the River of God flow freely here, that we would allow the Spirit of God to open our minds to see the grand things that he is at work doing! That we wouldn't get caught up in our small pictures of the church or the small boxes in which God is allowed to work, but that we would have a Spirit-filled imagination of what God could do in us and among us!

It is my heart's desire that He would pour his Spirit out on our lives, that we would be sanctified and transformed. That the oppressed would be set free, and the broken would be healed. That those who are lost would be found, that those who feel dead would find life. That all would find life. That we would drink of the living water and never be thirsty again!

Not only that all who are here would find life, but that the river of life would flow out from us and into our communities. The communities where we live. The community surrounding our church. The community at Landmark.

Conclusion

Let the River flow! Holy Spirit come and move in power! In the days ahead may God lead us! May we have eyes to see what God is doing in us, among us, and around us, that we would not stand in the way of what God is doing but participate in it. That we would generously give of ourselves for the sake of the Kingdom. For the sake of the church. For the sake of one another. For the sake of the lost. That we would generously give our energies, and our time, our talents, and our resources, for the sake of what God is doing in and through His church. God has been faithful to us. And God will continue to be faithful – it is who he is.

As we enter this new fiscal year together, may we find ourselves in the flow, participating in the work God is doing in our own lives, as well as in the lives around us.

I truly count it a privilege to serve as pastor here. It is a privilege to witness the work of God in your lives. It is a privilege to walk alongside you. It is a privilege to serve with you in God's Kingdom. We are in this together. And I cannot wait to see where the movement of God takes us in the days ahead.


